PARENTAL ALIENATION SYNDROME

- Starts with divorce or separation
- Draws a child into siding with one parent...
- ...and rejecting the other parent that previously had a strong bond with the child
- It is based on criticisms that are petty or false
- It is devastating!



THE ALIENATING PARENT MAY...

- Speak negatively about you in front of the child
- Exaggerate or lie
- * Share adult information
- * Throw out your gifts
- Listen in on your calls
- Withhold school or sports schedules
- Forbid references to you
- Block visits with you



YOUR CHILD MAY...



- Act like they hate you
- * Refuse to spend time with you
- Believe lies about you
- * Not show remorse for hurtful words or actions
- Parrot words and values of the other parent
- Exaggerate innocent behaviors of yours
- Ignore you or not acknowledge you

YOU MAY BE ESTRANGED FROM YOUR CHILD

- Which is devastating
- * Which is unfair
- Which may create grief as though your child has died

You may be in crisis because of it

- You will have to draw on all the love you have
